## Pioneer Pathways to Reopening

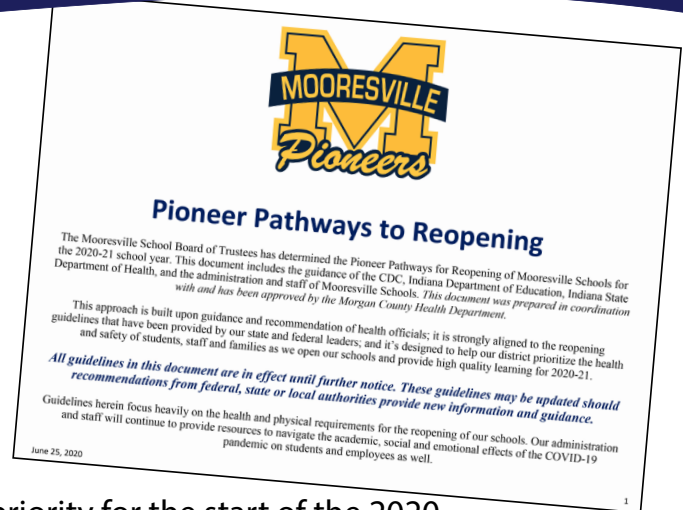

Today we are sending all of our families information about our return to school this fall. I want to thank all of the parents who completed our Return to School survey. Even without specific documentation, more than two-thirds of Mooresville families already say they are planning to send their children back to the classroom when we return on August 5. The level of trust and support our families have shown throughout this unprecedented time is incredible, and we are honored to be part of the Mooresville community.

About 50 parents, teachers, school administrators, and support staff members met in person and online to discuss Mooresville's Return to School plan.

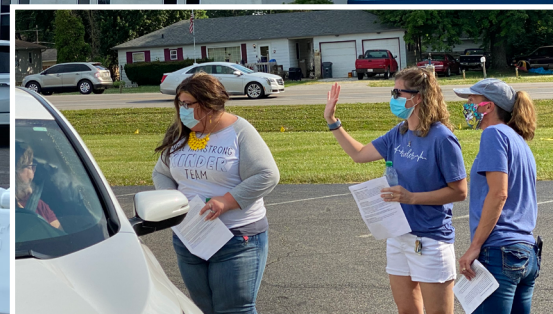

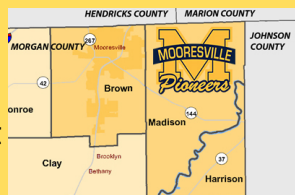

school building, and through every department. We've talked with other school districts across the county and central Indiana to determine best practices in all areas.

To help us navigate the changes that must occur to start school this fall, we have created our Pioneer Pathways to Reopening. This document has been reviewed and approved by the Morgan County Health Department. It includes is an overview of how we will start school, what opportunities students have for in-class or online learning, and commonly asked questions.

We've also included guidance provided by the Morgan County Health Department so our families know what to expect if a case or suspected case of COVID-19 occurs in our school community.

We know all of these documents may be updated as guidance from health authorities is updated, but we felt it was important for our families to have as much information as possible, as soon as we could give it. We have tried to create options for most situations, but know that we are still in a fluid situation.

The new system will help pull excess water away from Indiana Street. In addition to the construction on the campus, some drainage work is taking place on West Carlisle Street.

### New Vaccination Requirement for All K-12

**Students**-Indiana's immunization requirements for 2020-21 include a new requirement for ALL students to have 2 doses of Hepatitis A vaccine. Students entering kindergarten, 6th and 12th grade have additional vaccinations needed. Families are encouraged to contact their family doctor as soon as possible. Any child who needs their Hepatitis A vaccinations will need to have two doses spaced six months apart. Those in need of vaccination assistance should contact the Morgan County Health Department at 765-342-6621.
