## Back-to-School Events

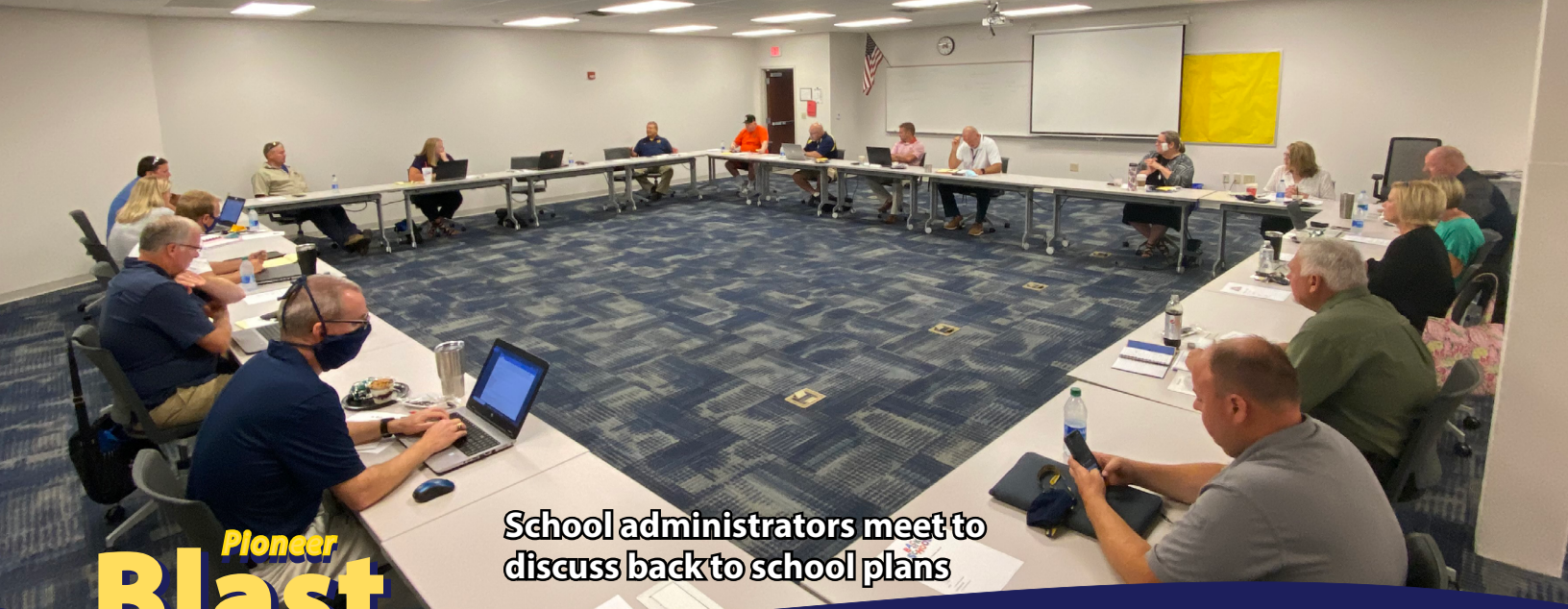

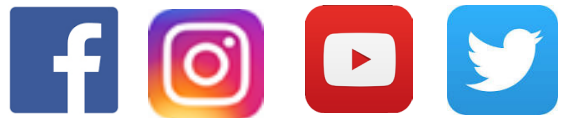

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## Traffic and Drainage Project Continues

The morning and afternoon traffic patterns around MHS, PHMS and Northwood will have a new look this fall. Work has begun to add two parking lots on the east and southeast sides of the MHS campus. The new parking lots will provide more than 270 new parking spaces. In addition, the project includes two more areas for traffic to enter and exit the campus.

One of the most important parts of the project won't even be seen when work is complete. Underneath both parking areas is a new drainage system to help excess runoff to the west. The new system will help pull excess water away from Indiana Street. In addition to the construction on the campus, some drainage work is taking place on West Carlisle Street.

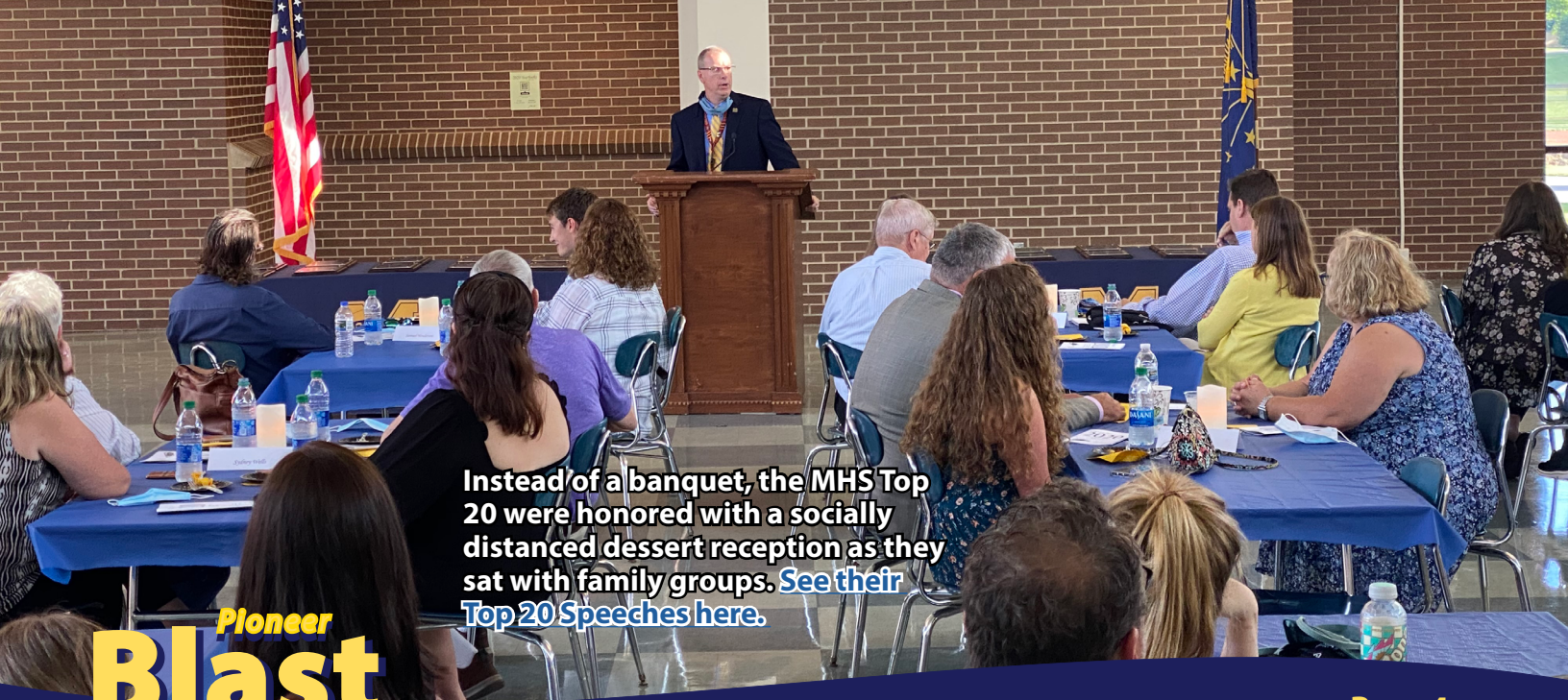


The southeast lot will connect to Carlisle St.

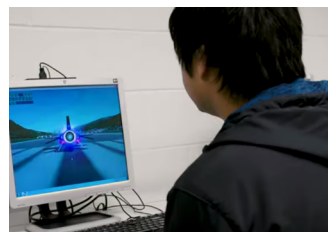

# News Briefs

**New Vaccination Requirement for All K-12 Students** - Indiana's immunization requirements for 2020-21 include a new requirement for ALL students to have 2 doses of Hepatitis A vaccine.

Students entering kindergarten, 6th and 12th grade have additional vaccinations needed. Families are encouraged to contact their family doctor as soon as possible. Any child who needs their Hepatitis A vaccinations will need to have two doses spaced six months apart.

Per the IDOE, our vaccination deadline is September 2. Students may be excluded from school after that if they don't have proper documentation. A Franciscan Health Vaccination Clinic will be at PHMS on Sat., Aug. 1, 9-11a.m. to assist with vaccinations. Families should register at 317-528-6374 to ensure there is enough vaccine.

## Back to School Information

### RETURN-TO-LEARN REGISTRATION

We want our families and our schools to start the year with information needed to provide the best experience possible. Please be sure to complete your child's Return-to-Learn registration in Skyward as soon as possible. In addition to annual back-to-school forms, this year's registration includes: Student Education Plan (in-person vs. online), COVID-19 Information, Student Transportation Plan, and Family Services Information.

### VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS

All students are required to have 2 Hepatitis A vaccinations this year. Also, those entering kindergarten, 6th, and 12th grade need vaccination boosters. Per the IDOE, our vaccination deadline is September 2. Students may be excluded from school after that if they don't have proper documentation. A Franciscan Health **Vaccination Clinic** will be at PHMS on Sat., Aug. 1, 9-11a.m. to assist with vaccinations – register at 317-528-6374 to ensure we have enough vaccine.

### SCHOOL SUPPLIES

Elementary and middle school lists are available at [MooresvilleSchools.org/Students](https://www.MooresvilleSchools.org/Students). High school supplies will vary by classes taken. Families in need of assistance should check "I will need assistance with school supplies" on their Return to Learn Registration and will receive information about a drive-through distribution. All students will be required to have masks which fully cover the nose and mouth to ride buses, enter school buildings and use when social distancing cannot occur. Students should have water bottles for use with water dispensers as well. Those who would like to donate school supplies are encouraged to bring items or monetary donations to the Mooresville Schools Education Center.
