and the teacher. While in-class teaching is the best option for learning, we wanted to find a system that would make virtual learning as close as to the inperson experience as possible."

The solution included a WebEx platform with TelePresence equipment. WebEx allows for a secure continuous learning environment for the students, making the classrooms visible only to those with correct logins and passwords and other security to block potential hackers.

The TelePresence camera systems allows the teachers are able to move around the room to teach, all while staying engaged with their students in the classroom and online. Enhanced microphone technology keeps the audio levels where they need to be despite movement.

The system also allows teacher time savings based on the ability to digitally collaborate on and share lesson plans. Teachers can also allow guest speakers to join online and share their remote video for a virtual field trip and lesson.

After a class, teachers are able to share video content online for students to review. Recorded sessions can even be enhanced with subtitles and language translations.

community to remember three important steps as we adjust to colder weather and flu season.

Keep Vigilant Outside of School - Please remember that parties, sleepovers, and other events bringing people together without social distancing and masking can have repercussions through school as well as home. Schools must do 48-hour look-backs on students who have symptoms and test positive. If a child attends a party on a weekend, develops symptoms and leaves school on Wednesday, and tests positive on Thursday, the school must contact trace and quarantine all students who were within six feet of the positive case patient for 15 minutes

Keep Checking Every Day - The list of symptoms from the state include many signs of mild and common illnesses. Simple headaches and sore throats can, within a day, become something more serious. Please err on the side of caution if your child develops symptoms. Keep your child home and begin eLearning. State rules allow students who are home due to COVID-19 related issues to complete work online and not face any attendance consequences.

To continue professional development for teachers and strengthen students' resources in the event of eLearning across the district, Mooresville Schools will host another eLearning day for all students on Wednesday, Nov. 4.

The day will be similar to the Sept. 30 eLearning Day, with students staying home and receiving instruction and online lessons for the day. Families should watch for specifics from their child's teacher(s) prior to the day.

**Mooresville Families -**Please be sure to assess student and staff member health each day before attending school.

### **COVID-19 Screening for Parents**

Every morning before you send your child to school please check for signs of illness:



- \*May present with more than one symptom. This list does not include all possible symptoms.
- Does your child have any sign of illness above?
- Were you in close contact (within 6 feet for more than 15 minutes) with anyone confirmed with COVID-19?

- If the answer is YES to any of the questions, DO NOT send your student to school. Instead, begin isolation of your child and contact your healthcare provider. Have you been tested for COVID-19? Only a positive test or provider diagnosis can confirm if someone has a current infection.
- Please keep your student home until they meet the criteria on the chart on back of the page.
- If you have trouble breathing, chest pain, new confusion, inability to wake or stay awake or bluish lips or face

#### In addition to the above, do not attend school if:

- You are awaiting COVID-19 test results.
- Any member of the household has tested positive or is awaiting test results due to exposure/symptoms.
- Any member of the household is home from work or school with COVID-19 symptoms.

If a person is at home for any of the above reasons, the person should stay at home until Indiana State Department of Health Return to School guidance is met. When in doubt, stay home and contact your school nurse or the Morgan County Health Department (765-342-6621) for guidance.
