The clinics on February 12 and March 12 will include pediatric and adult vaccinations and booster vaccinations. A separate area for COVID-19 testing will also be available each day.

#### **About the vaccines:**

- This is a FREE vaccine
- · You can choose the Pfizer, Moderna, or Johnson & Johnson vaccine if you are 18 or older.
- If you are 5 to 17 years old, you can receive the Pfizer vaccine.
- Johnson & Johnson (Janssen) is only one dose
- · Pfizer and Moderna require two doses
- · Each vaccine is fully tested and highly effective at preventing serious illness from COVID-19
- · Booster vaccinations available for those who received primary vaccination series at least 5 months ago (Pfizer & Moderna) or at least 2 months ago (Johnson & Johnson)

#### **SAT Now Indiana Graduation Exam**

The state of Indiana will use the national SAT (Scholastic Assessment Test) as the new graduation qualifying exam for students beginning with the Class of 2023.

All students, beginning with this year's juniors, will be required to take the test, which measures mathematics, reading, and writing standards.

This year's junior class will all take the SAT during the school day on Thursday, March 3. Their scores will be used to fulfill some of their graduation requirements.



# Coronavirus COVID-19 Protocols 2021-2022 Second Semester

Please Note: These protocols reflect current guidance from federal, state and local health officials. Should guidance change, school protocols will be updated to reflect current information. 1/5/22

The safety and well-being of our students and staff are of utmost importance. We appreciate everyone's help with the following:

- Masks are highly recommended in all situations.
- Masks are required:
  - **-on school buses** for the duration of mask guidance for public transportation
  - -during days 6-10 of return to school after isolation/ quarantine (days 1-10 for fully vaccinated close contacts). Masks will be provided to those who do not have them.
- Close contact and quarantine guidance will be followed in accordance with <a href="Indiana Code 16-41-2-1">Indiana Code 16-41-2-1</a>. No one will be asked about vaccination status except as part of a close contact situation.
- Assigned seating and increased spacing between students will remain in classrooms, cafeteria, and other settings
- Increased cleaning and disinfection remain in place. School air filtration systems meet or exceed all requirements for fresh air circulation.
- Home test kits will not qualify as an alternate diagnosis or for an early return to school of a symptomatic person. A PCR or rapid test or alternate physician diagnosis is needed to return to school if there are symptoms.
- **Extracurricular (EC) activities** will follow MCHD, IHSAA and ISSMA guidance.

#### **Best Practices**

#### **Proper hand washing**

is the best way to limit the spread of germs. Students have many opportunities each day to wash hands and use sanitizer.

#### Monitoring student health

each day is crucial. Students with signs of illness (including but not limited to: fever, vomiting, diarrhea, cough, sore throat, and loss of taste or smell) should not come to school. Symptomatic students need a negative PCR or rapid test or alternate diagnosis to return to school.

#### Vaccinations

are recommended by the CDC for anyone age 5 or older.

#### When in doubt.

stay home and contact school health services or the Morgan County Health Department (765-342-6621) for guidance.

## Positive Case Isolation & Contact Tracing Quarantine Guidance

**Positive Test - Isolation:** Anyone who tests positive must stay home days 1-5 (date of symptoms or asymptomatic test is day "0") and may return to school days 6-10 if masked at all times and asymptomatic or symptoms resolved (fever-free for 24+ hours without use of medication and other symptoms improving).

Close Contact Quarantine - Fully Vaccinated: may remain in school as long as asymptomatic wearing a mask for 10 days (last day of contact is day "0"). Test day 5 if possible. If symptoms develop, must stay home and follow isolation guidance. May continue EC activities but must be masked while not actively performing/playing.

Close Contact Quarantine - Partially Vaccinated or Unvaccinated: must stay home days 1-5, test day 5 if possible, and may return to school days 6-10 if masked at all times and asymptomatic. If symptoms develop, must stay home and follow isolation guidance.

**Fully vaccinated:** those who have been vaccinated & boosted; had the second dose of Pfizer or Moderna vaccine 2 weeks-6 months ago; or had J&J vaccine 2 weeks-2 months ago. Also anyone with documented positive case of COVID-19 within the past 90 days.

Partially vaccinated: those who have not been boosted but who had second dose of the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine more than 6 months ago or had the J&J vaccine more than 2 months ago.

**Unvaccinated:** those who have not had any vaccine; have not had the second dose of the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine more than 2 weeks ago; or have not had the J&J vaccine more than 2 weeks ago.

**Close Contact:** anyone within 6' of a positive case for 15 minutes or more over the course of a day. There is a 48-hour "lookback" for close contacts prior to symptom onset/positive test.
