Mooresville Adds Dedicated Officers

Mooresville Schools will have three officers dedicated to the safety of students, staff, and campuses this fall. This is a change from utilization of off-duty officers from Mooresville Police and Morgan County Sheriff's departments.

"We appreciate the previous arrangement and the partnership we've had with those departments and officers, but the officers were filling in off-duty time and sometimes filling all of the coverage needed was difficult," Superintendent Randy Taylor told the board when discussing the need for a school police department.

The officers will begin their roles with the start of school on Wednesday, Aug. 4.

HEALTH PROTOCOLS: Mooresville Schools will follow the guidance of the Morgan County Health Department (MCHD) as well as the Indiana Department of Health (IDOH) regarding COVID-19 protocols for the 2021-22 school year. All families will receive direct communication from our district regarding guidelines for Morgan County schools when they are available. Please note that the IDOH has stated contact tracing is required to continue at Indiana schools this year. Students who are fully vaccinated will not be required to quarantine after close contact as long as they do not develop symptoms. IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS: All students entering kindergarten, 6th, and 12th grade are reminded that vaccination boosters are needed. Our vaccination deadline is September 1. Students may be excluded from school after that if they don't have proper documentation. The Franciscan St. Francis **Vaccination Clinic** will be at MHS on Sat., July 31, 9am to noon to assist with vaccinations – register at 317-528-6374 to ensure we have enough vaccine.

PARENT COMMUNICATIONS: Families who've updated their telephone numbers, email or other contact information are strongly encouraged to log into their child's account to update contact information in Skyward (Parent Access database will reopen on or before July 26). As we send out Back to School information, we want to be sure all families get the updates they need. Email Skyward@MooresvilleSchools.org with any questions.

TRANSPORTATION QUESTIONS: If you have questions regarding a bus route or bus arrival times or if you are new to a bus route, please contact our Transportation Department at 317-831-9242. Please note that mask wearing is mandated on public transportation, including school buses, per the CDC.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES: Elementary and PHMS lists are available at www.MooresvilleSchools.org. High school supplies will vary by classes taken. Mooresville Schools' families in need of assistance with school supplies should contact their school to get needed items or stop by during normal school hours the week of July 26. Those who would like to donate are encouraged to bring items or monetary donations to the Mooresville Schools Education Center in the weeks prior to the event. Items needed most include boxes of tissues, pencils, glue sticks, black dry erase markers, scissors, folders with prongs, colored pencils, and backpacks.

NEW ENROLLMENTS: You may begin pre-enrollment online at www.MooresvilleSchools.org and will need to bring (or upload online) a birth certificate, shot records, 2 proofs of residency, and a parent/guardian government-issued photo ID to the school to complete enrollment. Please call your child's school to set an enrollment appointment (all school offices fully re-open beginning July 26) so we may get classes assigned and have everything ready for the start of school. Middle and high school families will need to set a time to meet with a counselor and schedule classes.

Coronavirus COVID-19 Protocols 2021-2022 School Year

Please Note: These protocols reflect current guidance from federal, state and local health officials. Should guidance change, school protocols will be updated to reflect current information. 7/19/21

The safety and well-being of our students and staff are of utmost importance. We appreciate everyone's help with the following guidelines for our return to school.

- **Masks are recommended** for anyone who has not been vaccinated. Masks are not required; however, we respect the right of anyone who chooses to wear a mask at school.
- **Masks are required on school buses** for the duration of CDC mask guidance for public transportation. Masks will be provided to those who do not have them.
- **Water bottling filling stations** will remain open and water fountains will remain closed. Students will be asked to use water bottles at school.
- **Assigned seating and increased spacing** between students will remain in classrooms, the cafeteria, and other group settings to fulfill contact tracing obligations.
- **Increased cleaning and disinfection** in all areas will remain in place. School air filtration systems meet or exceed all requirements for fresh air circulation.
- **Unvaccinated students or staff** who are close contacts with someone who has COVID-19 must quarantine per health department guidance. No student or staff member will be asked about vaccination status except as part of a close contact situation.
- **Home COVID-19 test kits** will not qualify as an alternate diagnosis or for an early return to school.
- **Extracurricular activities** will resume with the same protocols as school attendance. IHSAA and ISSMA guidance will be followed.

Best Practices

The 2020-21 school year taught us there are many important practices to help keep Pioneers healthy.

Proper hand washing

is the best way to limit the spread of COVID-19. Students will have many opportunities each day to wash their hands and use sanitizer.

Monitoring student health

before school each day is crucial. Students with a fever or signs of illness (including but not limited to: vomiting, diarrhea, uncontrolled cough, sore throat, and loss of taste or smell) should not come to school.

Vaccinations

are recommended by the CDC for anyone age 12 or older.

School health clinics

will have separate areas for students with symptoms.

When in doubt,

stay home and contact your school's student health services or the Morgan County Health Department (765-342-6621) for guidance.

Contact Tracing will still be in place in accordance with Indiana Department of Health guidelines.



Close contacts include anyone within 6' of the positive case for 15 minutes or more over the course of a day. There is a 48-hour "lookback" for close contacts prior to symptom onset/positive test.



Close contacts who do not show proof of vaccination will be required to quarantine. Vaccinated close contacts who are asymptomatic do not need to quarantine.
