## Free

 School Meal Program EndingThis fall, the USDA free school meal program will end. Families may begin putting money into their child's lunch account and/ or applying for free or reduced cost meals on Monday, July 25.

All families who believe they may be eligible for free or reduced school meals should log into their child's Skyward account to begin the application process.

Those who would like to pay for school lunches by cash or check may send payments to school with their child.

## 2022-2023 SCHOOL MEALS

 WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOWQUESTION: ARE SGHOOL MEALS FREE FOR ALL STUDENTS FOR THE 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR? ANSWER: No. Congress has not provided funding to the USDA for free meals for all students this school year. Meals will be full price for all students unless families apply for free or redveed meals and receive an email or letter from Mooresville Schools stating that they have been approved for the 20222023 school year. If you are not approved for free or reduced meals, students will need to have money in their lunch accounts beginning the first day of school.


QUESTION: HOW CANI GET FREE OR REDUGED PRICED FOR MY STUDENTS? ANsWER: If you have already received an email or letter from Mooresville Schools stating you are approved for free or reduced priced meals for the 20222023 school year, you do not need to do anything. Otherwise you must apply using the Free/Redveed Meals Application. A printed copy can be picked up at Mooresville Schools Education Center (11 W Garlisle St). Online applications will be available through Skyward Family Access on Monday, July 25 th .

QUESTION: DO INEED TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION FOR EACH CHILD? ANSWER: No. All the students in the household go on one applifation, even if they attend different schools within the distriet.

## QUESTION: ARE THERE ANY OTHER BENEFITS I MIGHT BE ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE?

ANSWER: Yes. The free and redveed meal applieation also is your application for book fee assistance. Addilitional benefits may be available too. Fill out the "Sharing Information with Other School Programs" form to receive the most benefits possible.

VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS: All students entering kindergarten, 6th, and 12th grade are reminded that vaccination boosters are needed. Our vaccination deadline is September 1. Students may be excluded from school after that if they don't have proper documentation. The Franciscan Health Vaccination Clinic will be at MHS on Sat., July 30, 9am to noon to assist with vaccinations - register at 317-528-6374 to ensure they have enough vaccine.

PARENT COMMUNICATIONS: Families who've updated their telephone numbers, email or other contact information are strongly encouraged to log into their child's Skyward account to update contact information. As we send out Back to School information, we want to be sure all families get the updates they need.

TRANSPORTATION QUESTIONS: If you have questions regarding a bus route or bus arrival times or if you are new to a bus route, please contact our Transportation Department at 317-831-9242.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES: Elementary and middle school lists are available at www.MooresvilleSchools.org. High school supplies will vary by classes taken. Mooresville Schools' families in need of assistance should plan to attend our School Supply Distribution on Saturday, July 30, 9am - noon at Mooresville High School. Students are encouraged to attend so they can pick out their backpack. Those who would like to donate are encouraged to bring items or monetary donations to the Mooresville Schools Education Center in the weeks prior to the event. Items needed most include boxes of tissues, pencils, glue sticks, black dry erase markers, scissors, plastic folders with prongs, colored pencils, and backpacks.

NEW ENROLLMENTS: You may begin pre-enrollment online at www.MooresvilleSchools.org and will need to either upload scans of required documents or bring them to school: a birth certificate, vaccinations records, 2 proofs of residency, and a parent/guardian government-issued photo ID. Please call your child's school to make sure your enrollment is complete (all offices are open beginning July 25) so we may get classes assigned and have everything ready for the start of school. All middle and high school families with newly enrolling students will need to set a time to meet with a counselor and schedule classes before the start of school.
