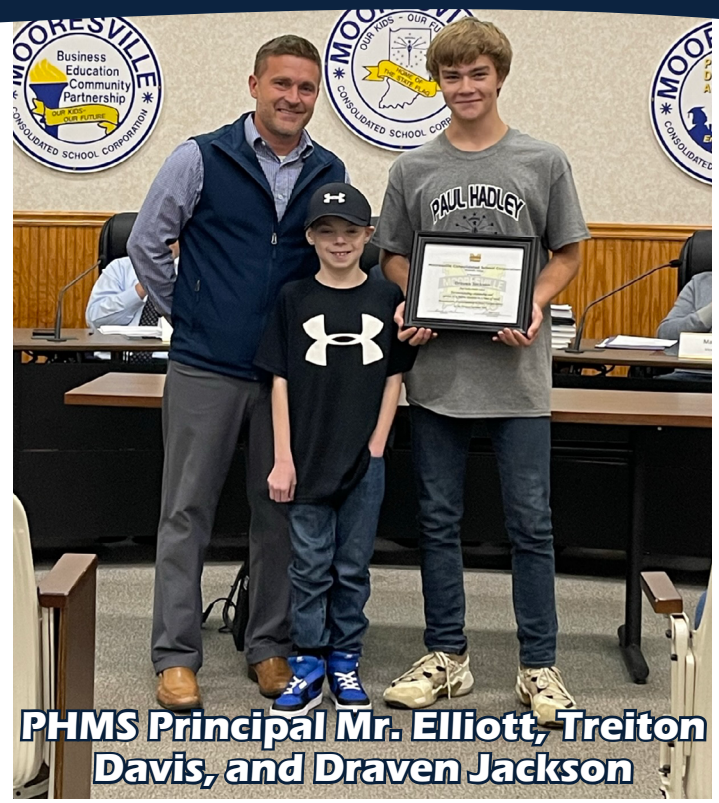
Celebrating Kindness

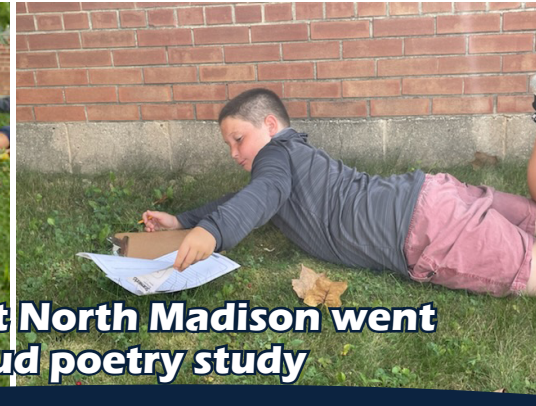

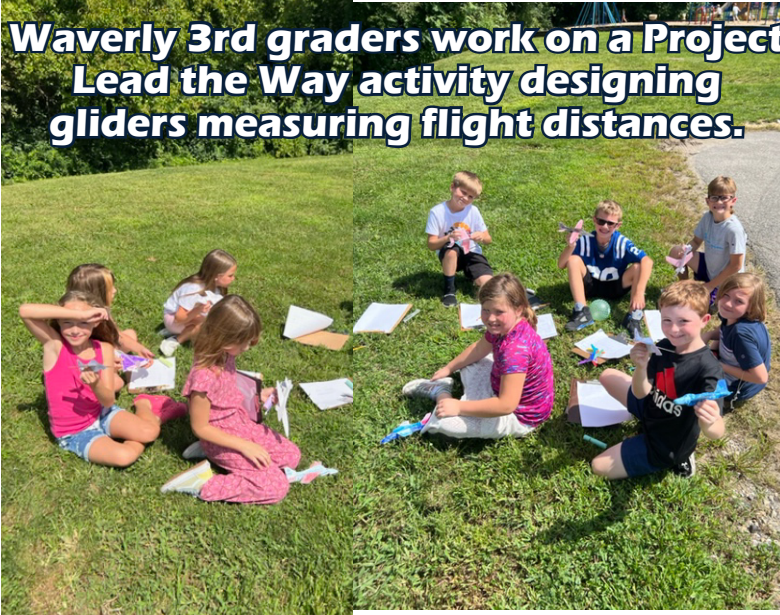

News Briefs

Football Stadium Safety: To increase safety for the large crowds attending MHS varsity football games, new protocols are in place for home football games.

Students found playing around in the stadium will be asked to sit with their parents or in a designated section of the stands. No footballs or other sports equipment are to be brought from home for use inside the stadium. In addition, there are no "pass outs" during the game. Anyone who leaves the stadium gates must return to their vehicle or be picked up and leave campus. No one will be allowed to hang around the outside of the stadium fence, play on the Northwood playground or basketball courts, etc. These changes were made in consultation with school law enforcement and to better align with stadium rules across the Mid-State Conference.
